Speaker Biographies

Sandra J. Kovacs, CMT, FAAMT – Sandy is no stranger to the BAC, having been a member since the mid 1980s, serving as president for 4 years, vice-president for 4 years and also serving as on-site coordinator for 3 symposia.

After serving in the capacity of a chiropractic assistant for 2 years in Florida, she found her true niche in careers in medical transcription beginning in 1978. Being the wife of a military man she found herself working as an MT and supervisor of the Central Transcription Pool at USAF Medical Center Wiesbaden Germany. Traveling with tours of duty, she went to Cocoa, Florida, home to Michigan, then was stationed here at WPAFB Hospital as assistant supervisor for the Medical Transcription Department. She was the owner/operator of Classic Medical Transcription, worked at Dartmouth Hospital, and then in 1995, her MT career veered off the normal path. Sandy added recruiter, trainer and mentor as well as medical reference book editor to her repertoire. Not the type of person to stagnate, she then became a test grader for Medical Transcription Education Center, Inc.

Sandy became a CMT in 1983 by examination and a Fellow of the American Association for Medical Transcription in March 2003. She has written many articles and participated as a speaker for several organizations including our own BAC. Sandy is currently employed by Opti-Script, Inc., a national service located in Pennsylvania, is currently serving as continuing education chair of Susquehanna Valley Chapter, is vice-president of the Pennsylvania Association for Medical Transcription and was the on-site coordinator for the 2006 PAMT annual meeting in May at Hershey.

DAN L, MISKA II, MS - Dan is presently a full-time instructor at Wright State University, Department of Neuroscience, Cell Biology and Physiology, Dayton, Ohio. He received his Bachelor of Science in Sports Medicine with a Minor in Biology in May 1997 and a Master of Science in Anatomy in June 1999. His teaching experience also includes Washington State Community College, Crowder College and Sinclair Community College.

Dan has been involved with Outreach to the Community, the Appalachian Science Camp, Upward Bound Science and Math, and TMJ Pain Management Seminars. Not only has Dan been involved with various committees at the college level, but he has also been an active participant in the American Cancer Society Relay for Life as well as a judge at various Science fairs in Ohio. He has received a variety of honors and awards including the Outstanding Service to Students through Washington State Community College 4 years in a row.



Mike Jackson - Mike "Scoop" Jackson is President of Integrity Marketing & Communications, Chairman/CEO of the American Veterans Institute (AVI) and National Chairman for Operation Welcome Home. He is the co-author of *Naked In Da Nang*, the book that inspired Operation Welcome Home. Jackson graduated from Ohio University in Athens, OH with a Bachelor of Science Degree. He later earned his Master's degree in business administration from Webster University. A decorated combat pilot, he served in the United States Air Force from 1968 to 1991, flying 210 combat missions in Vietnam. During his military career, he was awarded 21 different American and foreign decorations including the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Purple Heart.

Following his tour in Southeast Asia, Mike served as an Air Force instructor pilot, a squadron and group commander at the USAF Officer Training School, and as Professor of Aerospace Studies at Wright State University. In 1992, after retiring from the Air Force, he accepted a position as Executive Director of the National Aviation Hall of Fame, where he successfully guided the organization from a debt-ridden, one-person operation to a thriving, \$6 million facility featuring education programs, a world-class research center and a dynamic array of exhibits and interactives. He retired in 2005, and was named Executive Director Emeritus.

He was inducted into the Ohio Veterans Hall of Fame in 1997, in part because of programs he developed to assist unemployed veterans. In 1998 he was named the first "Hometown Military Hero" by the American Red Cross. A regular on the PBS and Discovery-Wings TV-series Legends of Airpower, Mike is also a popular public speaker and radio/television resource, discussing such topics as Operation Welcome Home, the air war in Southeast Asia, the military, and America's air and space heritage. He was named "Distinguished Museum Professional" of the year by the Ohio Museums Association in 2003 and "Outstanding Citizen of the Year for 2004" by his hometown of Tipp City, Ohio. Also in 2005, he was also chosen by Webster University as their "Distinguished Alumnus," based on "contributions to mankind." This honor is the highest bestowed by the Webster Alumni Association. In 2006, he was named National Member of the Month by the Military Order of the Purple Heart (April 2006) and was honored as an "Outstanding Citizen" by the Third Masonic District for the State of Ohio.

He has edited three books for publishers such as Simon & Schuster and Capstone Press. His own biography, Naked In Da Nang was released in late 2004, and was the inspiration for the national Operation Welcome Home. Operation Welcome Home took place throughout 2005 and over Veterans Day weekend in Las Vegas, attracting Vietnam veterans from all 50 states and featuring a 2 1/2 hour parade with over 3,500 veteran participants. Jackson and his business partner, Tara Dixon-Engel, are working on a new Operation Welcome Home celebration in California for Veterans Day 2006. Jackson is also the President of the VetAssist program, which assists veterans and their widows in securing VA benefits. Jackson and his co-author have also started work on a sequel to Naked In Da Nang. They are also currently working with Hollywood on developing the book as a film.



Tara Dixon-Engel -Tara Dixon-Engel is Vice President of Integrity Marketing & Communications. She is Co-Author of *Naked In Da Nang*, National Co-Chairman of Operation Welcome Home and President of The American Veterans Institute. After over a decade in newspaper journalism as an award-winning writer, Dixon-Engel moved into corporate marketing & communications. She also taught computer design at the college level and ran her own successful consulting business before joining the National Aviation Hall of Fame (NAHF) in 1999 as Director of Research and Strategic Planning. Dixon-Engel was instrumental in enhancing the annual Enshrinement Ceremony and creating "television quality" video presentations on each enshrinee. She also developed the programming for the highly successful Pioneers of Flight Homecoming in 2003. Her efforts were recognized by the Ohio Museums Association with 2004 Gold and Silver achievement awards.

In 2001, Dixon-Engel began writing *Naked In Da Nang*, with NAHF Executive Director Mike Jackson. The acclaimed book was published in late 2004 is now in its fourth printing It was the inspiration for *Operation Welcome Home*, the national celebration of America's Vietnam veterans. In 2005 she left her position at the National Aviation Hall of Fame to become National Co-Chairman of Operation Welcome Home with her co-author Mike Jackson. She and Jackson also founded The American Veterans Institute in order to perpetuate America's appreciation for and understanding of its military veterans and their individual histories.

From 2002-2005, she sat on the blue-ribbon panel of the Astronaut Hall of Fame in Titusville, FL and helped select the next class of astronauts for induction into the AHOF. She is a regular in seasons two, three and four of the PBS & Discovery Wings TV series *Legends of Airpower*. She has edited three aviation books for major publishers, and has just completed "The Wright Brothers," with Mike Jackson, for Sterling Press. Dixon-Engel and Jackson are currently assisting with the California Operation Welcome Home celebration slated for November of this year. They also operate the Vetassist program which helps veterans navigate the maze of VA benefits regulations.



O'DELL M. OWENS, M.D., M.P.H. Dr. O'dell Moreno Owens is a native Cincinnatian. Following graduation from Woodward High School, he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Antioch College. Dr. Owens spent his third year of college at Makerere University in Kampala, Uganda, as a foreign exchange student.

Dr. Owens attended Yale University Medical School where he earned his M.D. degree. In his spare time as a medical student he served as president of his medical school class, captain of the medical school basketball team, he served as a member of the Board of Trustees of Antioch College and earned a masters degree in public health from Yale University. He continued his studies at Yale as an intern, resident and chief resident in obstetrics and gynecology. He was awarded the Irving Friedman Award as the Outstanding Chief Resident in the department of OB/GYN at Yale Medical School.

Dr. Owens then accepted a combined position at Harvard Medical School. He served as a clinical instructor in the department of OB/GYN at Harvard Medical School, and was a Fellow in reproductive Endocrinology and infertility for two years.

He returned to his native Cincinnati in 1982 to establish the first division of reproductive endocrinology in the department of OB/GYN at the University of Cincinnati Medical Center. During his four years that he served in the medical school, he established an in-vitro fertilization program and achieved Cincinnati's first successful conception and delivery. In November 1988, Dr. Owens announced Cincinnati's first pregnancy from a frozen embryo.

Dr. Owens' other interest, besides infertility, is laser surgery. In 1987, Dr. Owens was asked to participate, at the request of the Chinese Medical Society, in an international symposium and lecture series on laser surgery in China. He was given a certificate of appreciation from the Shanghai Medical Society for these efforts. In July 1990, Dr. Owens was asked by the American Laser Society to join a group of physicians to tour the laser facilities in four major cities in the Soviet Union. In 1992, Dr. Owens was selected by the National Jewish Committee to visit Israel. This trip was part of a national group of Afro-Americans to evaluate the Israeli/Arab conflict firsthand.



O'DELL M. OWENS, M.D., M.P.H - (Continued from previous page) During the bicentennial year, the Bicentennial Commission honored Dr. Owens as one of the Bicentennial's 200 Greater Cincinnatians. This selection was in recognition of community service. In October 1988, Black Enterprise Magazine selected Dr. Owens as one of the top 15 black doctors in America. Dr. Owens has also been appointed an Honorary Kentucky Colonel. He has also been honored with the Tree of Life Award by the American Jewish

Committee, the Lincoln Award from the Northern Kentucky University, Honorary Ph.D. from the University of Cincinnati, and was the youngest person inducted into the Ohio Independent College Hall of Excellence.


In 2004, Dr. Owens was elected as Hamilton County's Coroner and he currently holds the position of President and Chairman of the Board for Project GRAD (Graduation Really Achieves Dreams), a collaborative of the Cincinnati Public School system. He is the former President and Chief Executive Officer to RISE Learning Solutions, Inc a national non-profit organization that uses technology to bring world-class training to adults who care for preschool aged children. ProjectGRAD and RISE are both initiatives of KnowledgeWorks Foundation. Previously, Dr. Owens was Senior Medical Director of United Healthcare of Ohio. Dr. Owens is currently a member of the Board of Directors for US Bank, and the Greater Cincinnati/Northern Kentucky Airport. He is the former chairman of the Cincinnati Public Schools Superintendent Advisory Committee the Cincinnati Public Schools, the Cincinnati Board of Health and University of Cincinnati Board of Trustees.

Dr. Owens is actively involved in the Cincinnati community working with the disadvantaged youth to motivate them to reach their full potential. He has also appeared on many local and national television shows. Dr. Owens would like his epitaph to read, "He made a difference."

Vallie Piloian, CMT, FAAMT -- Vallie currently is the Director of Quality Assurance at Medware, Inc., working at their Maitland, Florida, office. She is currently serving her fourth year on the AAMT Board of Directors, as the 2006 AAMT President. Vallie served as President of the Central Florida Chapter of AAMT in 2000 and President of the Florida Association for Medical Transcription in 2002. She was awarded FAMT's Member of the Year Award in 2003 and was the recipient of the Seminole Community College Distinguished Alumni Award in 2003.
